



## Why Mentorship Matters in Medical Writing

- Tech integration (AI, data visualization, etc.)



# Mentorship can unlock hidden pathways: Mentoring plays a critical role in raising awareness, especially since the career is still relatively new in some countries.

## Career entry is evolving:

Entry-level roles highly sought after. Experience prerequisite creates a catch-22. Mentorship and internships are crucial in bridging this gap.







## REGIONAL mentorship networks

- Regional groups are nurturing talent (eg, ACSE!)
- Tailored Webinars and meetings and workshops

### GLOBAL FLUENCY & remote mentoring

- Multilingual, culturally agile writers are in demand
- Remote mentoring enables global exchange
- Soft skills= competitive advantage in global teams

## Perspectives from Academia

- Academic training contributes to writing skills
- Gaps often seen when moving from academia to industry
- Role of academic mentors (eg, PhD advisors, and their feedback/limitations)
- Transition story from academia to medical writing
- Foundational skills:
   Scientific rigor...guidelines (GPP 2022, CONSORT, PRISMA, STROBE).
   Clarity and precision: communicate complex information

Ethics in publication: eg, ICMJE, COI, plagiarism

#### INDUSTRY

- Internal mentorship programs (formal and informal)
- Onboarding and skill transfer in med comm teams
- Challenges (e.g., workload, mentor availability, remote work)

#### **CONSULTING & FREELANCE CONTEXTS**

- Lack of formal structures —peer mentoring, networking
- **Strategies:** LinkedIn, freelance circles, mentorship through professional associations (eg, ACSE)
- Creating YOUR OWN board of mentors (your own "Ateam")

## **UPSKILLING...FUTURE PROOFING**



#### UPSKILLING...FUTURE PROOFING

- eg, Al in writing and reviewing
- -Strategic thinking, data interpretation, cross-functional collaboration
- -Soft skills and **HUMAN OVERSIGHT** awareness

### • Current picture:

- Al accelerates writing: (also, lacks depth and accuracy; human oversight is essential).
- Al adoption will continue: Human critical thinking, data interpretation, collaboration remain vital.
- Soft skills and awareness of AI limitations help maintain research quality and integrity.
- Upskilling should blend strategic use of AI with strong human judgment.

## ATTENTION ECONOMY

- Information overload
- LinkedIn, BlueSky, and alternative communication channels
  - Flood of Content
  - Quality vs. Quantity Dilemma
  - More research → More journals → More noise → Increased value of attention

<u>Mentoring in the attention economy</u>: just writing skills are insufficient; stand out in a crowded field, leverage digital channels, and CONTINUOUS LEARNING
